THE BISHOP IS COMING

Bishop Hollerith is coming to Christ and Grace on **Sunday morning, March 11**, to speak to the Adult Education class at 9:30 and then preach, celebrate and confirm during the 10:30 service. A class has already started for some of our younger members on Sunday mornings and **David will offer a class** for older teens or adults who wish to be confirmed or received into the Episcopal Church. If you are interested, please call the church office: 733-7202. This class will begin the week of February 5.

EXPERIENCE THE DIVINE

Tuesdays during Lent, beginning on **February 28, at 5:30 p.m.**, you are invited to a 45-minute session set aside for listening to God and being in God's presence. Participants will sit in comfortable chairs in the **upstairs Guild Room**. In the first 15 minutes, anyone who wishes may share something he or she believes was an expression of the Divine. It could be an Aha! moment and can occur through any number of avenues: something in nature, a word of scripture or other written materials, music, dreams, a sudden insight, a picture, another's voice, an experience or encounter.

After this sharing time, we will spend the remaining 30 minutes or so being quiet trying to still our minds so as to open our hearts to God's presence within us. If you haven't ever tried this form of contemplative prayer, there will be some simple suggestions offered to help make the period of silence more meaningful. (The concept of this service emerged from our strategic planning process.)



WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 22 - NOON AND 5:30 P.M.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the special church season of Lent. We start this season with the mark of ashes upon our foreheads to indicate our admission of sin and to be reminded that we are mortal and to dust we shall return. Ash Wednesday is also one of two fast days in the Episcopal Church. (The other is Good Friday.) Make a good start to the Lenten season by attending church at noon or 5:30 p.m.

THE LENTEN SPEAKER/LUNCHEON SERIES BEGINS TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 28

The Rev. Dr. Keith R. Emerson, Rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Suffolk, will be the first Lenten speaker. Keith and David were in seminary together.

LENTEN POTLUCK/ MOVIE NIGHTS During our season of Lent, we have Wednesday night potluck/movie night beginning at 6 p.m. on Wednesdays, February 29 through March 28. Our movie this year is Walking Across Egypt, starring Ellen Burstyn. This movie is described as a warm family drama. We will watch approximately 15-20 minutes each night after sharing a potluck meal. All ages are welcome and encouraged to attend.

About the movie: Mattie (Burstyn) is an aging southern belle who realizes that she's getting too old to go on living in a house. After an odd encounter with the local dogcatcher, Lamar (Mark Hamill), Mattie befriends Lamar's bad-egg nephew, Wesley (Jonathan Taylor Thomas).

We are already well into the new year and the season of Epiphany, but I am sure you will agree that our services during the Christmas season were the best ever. I wish to extend my sincere thanks to **Claire Brill, Tim Richardson, Bruce Dersch** and all the choirs for their extra hours of preparation and rehearsal. The new Girls' Choir, which was an integral part of the pageant, has received endless accolades. Whatever your Lenten discipline might be, ask yourself if it leads to giving God more of your time and attention. Giving up something can make a difference if it allows for something better to take its place - in this case, time with the Holy One. More than anything else, God wants our undivided attention so we can be lavished with love.

Copies of the book will be on sale for \$10.25 each and will have a book mark that suggests a short chapter to read for each day in Lent.

VESTRY NEWS

In December we said thank you to **Sally Seward, Bee Betts** and **John Brockwell**, all of whom completed their three-year terms on the vestry, and we welcomed **Martha Burton, Ann Riggs** and **Jonathan Shockley** as our newly elected members. We voted to extend **Meredith Matthew's** term by one year to fill a vacancy.

This month we re-elected the following officers: **Nancy Rawlings**, Register, **Greg Gwaltney**, Treasurer, **Tommie Elder**, Senior Warden, and **Rick Talmage**, Junior Warden. We also appointed **Phil Barnes** to replace **Cleve Wright** as an Endowment Fund Trustee. Cleve completed two three-year terms and served as chairman. The other trustees are **Maureen McClure** and **Jimmy Thacker**. Jimmy will be the chairman.

Greg Gwaltney reported that over \$305,000 had been received in pledges for 2012, which is very close to the goal set by the vestry. With that good news and additional revenues, we were able to approve a budget totaling \$399,150. The vestry thanks you all for your excellent stewardship especially after also having pledged to the Campaign for Warmth earlier in the year. **Claire Brill** reported that the Sunday school rooms were being used once again with new radiators, paint and carpets.

Finally, David announced that another installment of \$15,000 was received from Jim and Bobbie Ukrop toward their \$100,000 pledge made to the endowment fund in memory of Flora Berkeley.

2011 YEAR-END STATEMENTS AND 2011 PLEDGE INCOME

The year-end Contribution Statements were recently mailed to all Christ and Grace contributors for 2011. Please take some time to review your statements. If you have any outstanding amount due on your 2011 pledge, please remit it as soon as you are able and indicate it is for 2011. At the end of 2011, our pledge income was \$18,655 short of the total amount pledged, and our operating budget is dependent on this income. THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY

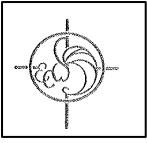

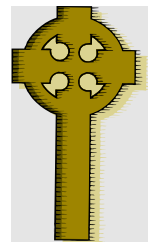
The **Thanksgiving and Christmas offerings** totaled \$1,234. Jackson Field Home for Girls and the Boys’ Home each received \$617 from this amount.
